

Feel the need to read (or listen) while you're at home?

TCFL has some great options for downloadable eBooks and eAudio. This week, we'll help you get started with Overdrive and Libby.

First things first, though – what do you mean Overdrive AND Libby? Overdrive is the name of the company that we get some of our downloadable content from. Libby is the name of the app that Overdrive created to help you get that content onto your mobile device. We'll use "Overdrive" to describe the general ideas and "Libby" if we're talking about something that's specific to the app.

And a few quick housekeeping details –

- Overdrive is just like the library, in that there are a set number of copies of each title in the collection – what that means to you is that sometimes, you will have to place a hold on popular items. Don't worry, though – Overdrive has a huge collection, and new books (and extra copies) are added all the time!
- You can borrow up to 6 titles at any one point in time – so you might need to return something early if one of your holds comes through!
- Unlike the library, books you borrow through Overdrive are returned automatically, even if you forget your due dates – so no worries about overdue fines! If something gets returned before you finish it, you can always borrow it again.

Let's get started!

Do you want to download eBooks and eAudiobooks to a mobile device like your smartphone or tablet?

- From your device, visit your app store and download the free Libby by Overdrive app.
- Open the app and find your library – just start typing in "Talbot" and TCFL should pop up.
- Follow the directions to set up your Libby account – you'll need your library card number to get started.
- Start searching for your next great read!

Or maybe you'd rather download books to your eReader?

- From your computer, visit the Library's "Download and Stream" eResource page at <http://tcfl.org/eresources/?view=1&sid=3> and select "Overdrive/Libby"
- Click on the "Sign In" link on the far right side of the page (it's a blue button)
- Select "Talbot County Free Library" from the drop-down menu and enter your library barcode number. (Don't have a library card? Head over to <http://tcfl.org/find/?content=getacard> and scroll down to sign up for a temporary library card.)

- Start searching for your next great read!

You can even use both Overdrive (the website) and Libby (the app) – one account works across many devices!
