From The Director's Desk

To our community,

Thank you for taking the time to read our annual report and escape into our story which is one of hope and goodwill; of the library, our partners and the community pulling together to help neighbors during this tough time. Fiscal Year 2020-2021 was a time of inspiration and renewal for the Talbot County Free Library (TCFL). While the library building was closed at times due to the COVID-19 pandemic, staff were busy behind the scenes as over 270,000 items were borrowed; 1,100 craft bags were taken home by eager families; over 5,000 books-to-go bags were circulated to patrons; and over 400 in-person and virtual programs enriched the lives of over 16,000 adults and children. Even during periods of closure or limited in-person services, the Library remained a busy community hub with patrons coming to pick up books and crafts through our to-go service, participate in several outside Community Days, and attend many outside and virtual programs. Staff reintroduced our youngest customers to the library through outside story times and story walks. Our teams have continued to provide essential services and resources to our community during the pandemic and have never stopped working.

We've written and rewritten the library's story in FY21, changing service levels, adding new technology, getting all TCPS students virtual library cards, and supporting the community through many different outreach events. Through the Maryland State Library (MSL), TCFL received Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant funding to extend safe, secure public internet access to patrons outside of our branches and to purchase more Wi-Fi hotspots for our patrons to borrow. The availability of these hotspots created opportunity and equity for those in our community who did not have good access to high-speed Internet. This past year we celebrated the 40th anniversary of the St. Michaels Library. I want to personally thank all of you who wrote letters of advocacy in support of expanding and renovating the St. Michaels Library. The library will learn early next year if we will receive grant funding for design work to begin in FY23. If grant funding is received for all phases of the project, construction should be completed in 2025 in time for TCFL's 100th anniversary. Moving into the New Year the library will continue to reflect the changing needs of our community with both innovative services and the basics. We are here for you no matter what happens. The library staff look forward to serving you in the coming year.



Community Program Highlights

Frederick Douglass Day 2021

Every year, The Talbot County Free Library joins The Frederick Douglass Honor Society, to celebrate the life and legacy of Frederick Douglass. The celebration took place virtually due to COVID-19. John Stauffer, Professor of English and of African American Studies at Harvard University was the keynote speaker. Other activities throughout the day included a children's virtual village and discussions of Frederick Douglass statues around the world.

The 6th Annual Chesapeake Children's Book Festival

Headlining the hybrid festival was awarding winning children's author and illustrator Bryan Collier, a Pocomoke, Maryland native. Books authored and/or illustrated by Collier include "We Shall Overcome"and "Fifty Cents and a Dream: Young Booker T. Washington". During the week before the Festival, a different author read each night via Facebook Live. Others read via Facebook Live during the festival including David LaRochelle, Carole Boston Weatherford, Ann Brashares, and Thrity Umrigar.

Latinx KidLit Book Festival

The Latinx Kid Book Festival was a virtual celebration of Latinx KitLit authors, illustrators, and books. The virtual festival presented two free days of keynote sessions, Q&A events, and panels with Latinx authors and illustrators of picture books, middle grade, young adult, graphic novels, and poetry.

The Library Guy Interviews Alice McDermott


Bill Peak, Talbot County's "Library Guy," interviewed National Book Award Winner Alice McDermott, who has been called, "The Virginia Woolf of American Letters." Peak's interview took place in the fall of 2020 as part of a partnership with *The Talbot Spy* to introduce area readers to the poets and writers behind some of our country's best literature.

COVID-19 Update with Fredia Wadley

During the Fall of 2020, the number of COVID-19 cases was rising in Talbot County. Talbot County Health Officer Fredia Wadley talked to "Library Guy" Bill Peak about the latest information on COVID-19 and the progress of the vaccine development.

Cabin Fever Film Festival

During the winter months, the Talbot County Free Library offered the community two free films to stream: Rob Reiner's *The Magic of Belle Isle* and *This Beautiful Fantastic*. In *The Magic Of the Belle*, Morgan Freeman moves to a remote village to regain his strength and rediscover his passion for writing. *The Beautiful Fantastic*, is a contemporary fairy tale that centers on the unlikely friendship between a reclusive young woman who dreams of writing children's books and a cranky widower. Both films also offered a Zoom discussion.

Book Discussion: Furious Hours: Murder, Fraud, and the Last Trial of Harper Lee by Casey Cep

The Easton Book Group discussed "Furious Hours: Murder, Fraud, and the Last Trial of Harper Lee" via Zoom. Author Casey Cep was on hand to join the discussion, which received positive feedback from book discussion members.

2021 Summer Reading: Tales and Tails

Over 1,300 people participated in the program that took place from June 1 through July 31. During both summer programs, children and adults logged in books or audiobooks into the Beanstack website/app, and received badges in the process. There was also an online memoir writing class. Children also had the opportunity to enjoy Outdoor Pre-School Story Time, Ukulele Series, It's Alive! Story Book Comes to Life (via Zoom), Turtles and Snakes! (via Zoom), and more! Over 500,000 Maryland residents participated in library summer programming in 2019.

Virtual Heritage Concert Series

This Zoom and Facebook Live program was a partnership with Carpe Diem Arts and Brookletts Place. The first concert took place in late March and featured two astounding groups. The first was duo Rakish, with violinist Maura Shawn Scanlin and guitarist Connor Hearn, who put on a performance that celebrated Irish American Heritage Month. The second performer was jazz, blues, and gospel singer Lea Gilmore, who offered songs to honor Women's History Month. The series was offered every fourth Friday through June.

Dr. Erika Lee: The Making of Asian America

In the spring of 2021, Dr. Ērikā Lee held a virtual discussion of her book. This book shows how generations of Asian immigrants and their American-born descendants have made and remade Asian American life in the United States.

Learn to play the Ukulele!

Children between the ages of six through sixteen were encouraged to learn to play the Ukulele! Once registered, they picked up their ukulele kit, which included the instrument, songbook, and more. They also received links to the video lessons via email.

SEED: The Untold Story

A Talbot Master Gardener Program, volunteer Mikaela Boley provided a free virtual screening to explore the importance of seeds, preservation of biodiversity, and the impacts on the environment. The film was followed by a discussion and participant Q&A discussing highlights from the film. Boley also answered questions regarding the Talbot County Free Library Seed Program.





Friends of the Talbot County Free Library

The Council of Friends of the Talbot County Free Library represents more than 200 individuals and businesses dedicated to promoting the Library through fundraising events, programs, and participation in many community events. The past two years were challenging but even with nearly 100% virtual programming, memberships held steady in 2020 and dropped just slightly in 2021. The Friends entered 2021 with new energy to sponsor inperson and virtual events such as the STEAM program, the 6th annual Chesapeake Children's Book Festival, monthly topical programs and the highly successful annual Book Sale, which was turned into a scaled-down "Bare Book Sale" in August, and inspired smaller book sales on the five Mondays in November. Based on the success of these "Pop Up Book Sales", the Friends plan to have several book sales in 2022. Unable to host any inperson fundraising events, the Friends held an online auction in May 2021 that attracted over 100 donations and several hundred bidders. Thanks to our proud sponsor Shore United Bank proceeds exceeded \$5,000! Our Annual Membership Drive in May also surpassed expectations with funds earmarked for the Saint Michaels branch renovation and expansion. St. Michaels Expansion & Renovation Update

In May of 2021, the Talbot County Free Library applied for matching funding from the Maryland Library Capital grant program to begin design planning for the expansion and renovation of the St. Michaels Library. If the grant is awarded and matching funding is provided by the County, the library plans to start design work in fiscal year 2023. The new design will preserve the beautiful park-like setting that is so loved by the community. The new library will feature expanded teen and children's areas, a larger meeting room, the addition of two study rooms, and added space for new library materials and computers. The project will also remedy current facility problems, including a deteriorating infrastructure and outdated mechanical and lighting systems. The Friends of the Talbot County Free Library and the Talbot County Free Library Foundation are both currently raising funds for new library materials, furnishings, and technology upgrades for the expansion of the St. Michaels Library.
