


for our students and families. The Raising a Reader program, a collaboration with TCPS, has been

effective in cultivating a love of reading among the youngest learners. Their initiatives contribute to a nurturing learning environment for all ages...making the Talbot County Free Library an outstanding partner in fostering educational success and community engagement." 7,676 children and teens in the county have library cards. Last year, the

2024 HIGHLIGHTS

A COMMUNITY CELEBRATION -- KIN: ROOTED IN HOPE

On February 24, 2024, at the Avalon Theater, author Carole Boston Weatherford and her son, illustrator Jeffrey Boston Weatherford, discussed their book, KIN: Rooted in Hope. The Bulletin of the Center for Children called KIN "gorgeously rendered," and one Kirkus Reviews described as "a striking work that reshapes the narrative around enslavement." KIN, which is set in Talbot County, was awarded a Coretta Scott King Honor, the Claudia Lewis Award from Bank Street College of Education and the Boston Globe/Horn Book Award. The Weatherfords' Avalon presentation was sponsored by the Talbot County Free Library, The Country School, The Avalon Foundation, and the following community partners: Academy Art Museum, Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum, Dorchester County Tourism, Easton Economic Development Corporation, Frederick Douglass Honor Society, Maryland Public Television, ShoreRivers, Talbot Arts, Talbot County Economic Development and Tourism, Talbot County Public Schools, Talbot Historical Society, WHCP FM 91.7 Music Discovery, NPR for the Midshore, and the Dock Street Foundation.

DIGITAL LITERACY/DIGITAL ACCESS

Talbot County Free Library has been building on a series of initiatives begun in 2020, funded in part by grants and other revenue sources, that have provided our rural community with improved access to, and training on, the internet and other digital literacy resources and technologies. Two of these initiatives include the creation of a Community Wi-Fi Center at Cordova Park, in Cordova, Maryland and the second, offering computer classes and programs related to new technologies. In 2024, people used the library's wireless network 52,919 times, and our extensive e-resources and downloadables were used 144,498 times. The library also conducted 79 digital literacy classes, with a combined instruction time of over 206 hours with 381 students attending. The library continues to work with our partners across the state to provide improved access to the internet and provide instruction on a wide range of digital technologies.

ST. MICHAELS BRANCH EXPANSION

The St. Michaels Library has been a place of renewal and growth for so many in the St. Michaels and Bay Hundred community. In addition to being able to offer state-of-the-art library services and resources, the new library will sustain an inclusive and empowered community with the space to realize their aspirations and achieve their literacy and learning goals.

FRIENDS OF TALBOT COUNTY FREE LIBRARY



The year 2024 held special significance for the Friends of the Talbot County Free Library, which celebrated its **50th anniversary** as a champion for our Library. The all-volunteer, non-profit organization was created in 1974 with the mission to advocate for the Library and to promote its value and services for the enrichment of the community. Through annual membership donations, book sales, and fundraising events, the Friends are able to sponsor the annual Chesapeake Children's Book Festival,

the Summer Reading Program, STEAM Day Camp for youngsters, book giveaways at the Easton Farmers Market and other community events. The Friends Council also actively promotes the Library in County budget hearings and grant requests.

The president of the Friends Council, Emilie Knud-Hansen, emphasized that recent fundraising has been dedicated to the expansion and renovation of the St. Michaels Branch. She states that, "It has been so successful the Friends celebrated their 50th anniversary with a \$50,000 gift to buy new library materials for the St. Michaels Branch." Library Director Dana Newman adds, "Without the generous support from the Friends, the library would not be able to provide as many new titles in the wide variety and range of fiction and non-fiction topics that we would like to offer in the newly-renovated library. This gift is such a meaningful way to celebrate the Friends 50th anniversary."

With 2025 marking the library's 100th anniversary, Emilie says the Friends will be active in sponsoring the Centennial celebration.
